-Tonight (Sunday, 3 November), we have our annual soup supper. Come join us for fun, food, and fellowship. It all begins at 5:30 pm in the Parish Hall, with a raffle and a silent auction. One of the auction items is a steak dinner for six cooked by our very own Fr. Stoley. Come eat and check out some of the other items on our auction.

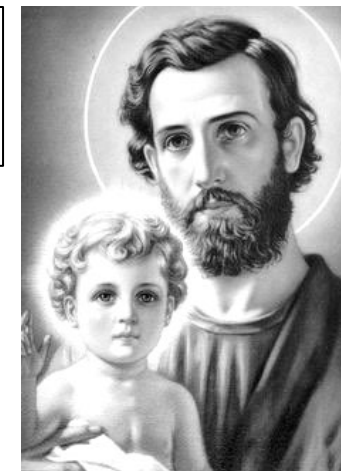
-Esta noche (Domingo, 3 Noviembre) tenemos nuestra cena de sopas. Vénganse a comer y convivir con nuestra familia parroquial. Empieza a las 5:30pm en el salon parroquial. Con una rifa y una subasta silente.

-Knights of Columbus will meet on Sunday, November 3 at 5 pm before the soup supper.

-From November 1-8, we have the opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence for the souls in Purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead on any or all of those days. You can also gain a plenary indulgence on All Soul's Day by praying for the dead in a church, praying an Our Father and the Creed.

Outside of these days, you can gain a partial indulgence for the souls in Purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."

An *indulgence* is the remission of temporal punishment we gain for our sins, i.e. time in Purgatory. There are two types of indulgences: plenary and partial. A *plenary indulgence* is the complete remission of our

temporal punishment and can only be acquired once per day; a *partial indulgence* is a partial remission, or a lessening, of our temporal punishment.

To acquire an indulgence, you must perform some sort of work of faith (there is a list you can find) and fulfill a few other conditions: baptized and not excommunicated, be detached from sin, go to confession within 7 days before or after the work performed, receive Communion on the day of the work performed or within a few days, and pray for the Pope's intentions on the day of the work performed or within a few days.

-Del primer día de Noviembre al día 8, tenemos la oportunidad de adquirir una indulgencia plenaria para las almas en el Purgatorio, por visitar un cementerio y orar por los difuntos uno o todos los días. También pueden adquirir una indulgencia plenaria orando un Padre Nuestro y el Credo en una iglesia por los difuntos.

Fuera de esos días, pueden adquirir una indulgencia parcial para las almas en el Purgatorio por visitar un cementerio y orando por los difuntos: "Deles descanso eterno, Señor, y que la luz perpetua brille sobre ellos. Que las almas de los fieles difuntos, por la misericordia de Dios, descansen en paz. Amén."

Una *indulgencia* es la remisión del castigo temporal que ganamos por nuestros pecados, que quiere decir, nuestro tiempo en el Purgatorio. Hay dos tipos de indulgencia: plenaria y parcial. Una *indulgencia plenaria* es la remisión completa de nuestro castigo temporal y se puede adquirir nada más una vez al día; una *indulgencia parcial* es la remisión parcial de nuestro castigo temporal, que quiere decir, pasamos menos tiempo en el castigo. Para que sepan:::**Castigo temporal** es el tiempo en purgatorio y termina con nuestra entrada en el cielo—**Castigo eterno** es el castigo del infierno y no termina nunca.

Para adquirir una indulgencia, tiene que hacer un trabajo de la fe (pueden encontrar una lista en Google) y cumplir uno requisitos más: que sea bautizado y no está excomulgado, separado del deseo de pecar, se confiesa un día cerca del trabajo ya hecho, recibe comunión el día del trabajo o un día cerca del trabajo, y orar por las intenciones del Papa Francisco el mismo día del trabajo o un día cerca del trabajo.
