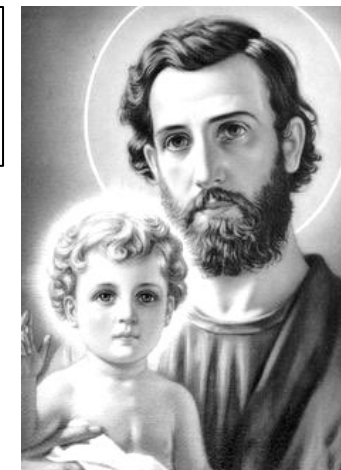
-The Senior Meal will be held on November 14th. RSVP to the usual suspects by 10 am on Monday, November 11.
